**2017 Yard Waste Site Stickers
Available—Site Opens April 15**

BPU Yard Waste Site Stickers are available at BPU Customer Service, 92 Steele Street; open 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday-Wednesday and 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Thursday-Friday.



The stickers are available free, one per solid waste account, for residential solid waste customers. They should be affixed to the rear driver's side window of your vehicle to enter the site.

The Yard Waste Site, at the end of Monroe Street, off 8th, will open, on Saturdays from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. April 15-November 11; and from 4-7 p.m. Wednesdays May 3-September 27. The Site accepts residential leaves, grass clippings & brush (8" diameter maximum). No trash, metal, tires, lumber, wood, concrete, rocks, sod, dirt & construction materials are accepted.

Spring Flushing Changes to Daytime: Be Alert to Schedules

The Jamestown Board of Public Utilities (BPU) Water Division announces that water main flushing will take place in daytime instead of nighttime, beginning in Spring, 2017.

The change to daytime flushing hours, which occurs in other Western New York communities, is purposed for greater efficiency and improved employee safety.

Not only will the hours change to daytime, says BPU General Manager David L. Leathers, but also the number of flushing days will be reduced from ten days to eight.

Pre-flushing in Falconer begins at 9 a.m. all day on Friday, April 28, in the area of Aldren, Ralph, Valmeere and Mapleshade. The rest of Falconer will be flushed as usual from 9 p.m. Saturday, April 29, into Sunday, April 30, until the entire Village is flushed. Discolored water may be seen in Falconer and on the north side of Jamestown on Sunday as a result of flushing.

Following Falconer, flushing in the rest of the water system will take place from 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Monday, May 1, through Friday, May 5, and from Monday, May 8, through Wednesday, May 10.

The exception will be downtown flushing that will take place from 5:30 a.m. Wednesday, May 3, for approximately 2-4 hours, in order that restaurants and businesses will be free of flushing early in the day.

"We plan to flush more hydrants each day in fewer days, with the daytime advantage of improved visibility," states Leathers.

Employees will be able to see the color of the water that is flushed from the hydrant without the help of artificial lighting. In daylight, employees also will be in



less danger of hazardous walking and other situations.

Flushing trucks this spring, in addition, will be equipped with mounted diffusers that point water downward into streets along curbs and away from terraces and yards. Truck attachments will minimize damage sometimes caused to private yards and terraces.

Attached to this newsletter is a two-page informational sheet describing which location will be flushed on which day.

Specific flushing location descriptions will be posted daily on Facebook/Twitter and on our website: www.jamestownbpu.com

Actual daily maps showing which hydrants are to be flushed each day also will be posted in April and May on our website. The hydrants to be flushed on that date are colored in bright light blue on the maps.

Recordings of daily flushing locations are available by calling 661-1660, extension 6.

Water customers should note when crews are flushing in their neighborhoods. Flushing occurring on nearby streets also could cause discolored water on your street.

Customers with questions about their flushing dates may call the Flushing Hotline at 661-1688 or BPU Communications at 661-1680. If callers receive voicemail, they should leave their street name, the names of the streets at the end of their block and their phone numbers. BPU employees will return calls with the flushing locations.

Why Is It Important to Know Your Flushing Day?

When the BPU flushes in your area, it is likely that discolored water will run from your water faucets or in toilets.

Although the water is safe to use, it is displeasing in appearance and also may discolor laundry washed in the unsettled water.

Customers who know about discolored water in advance can put aside drinking or cooking water and delay washing clothes until the water appears to be clear. If customers can avoid opening faucets or flushing toilets during the scheduled flushing time, they may not notice any evidence of flushing.

Customers who get caught with discolored laundry as a result of flushing may stop at the BPU Customer Service Office, 92 Steele Street, to obtain a commercial rust/iron stain remover free of charge. Customer Service is open from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday-Wednesday and from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Thursday-Friday.

Why Flush Water Lines Twice a Year?

The BPU flushes water mains each spring and fall by opening hydrants systematically and letting water run full force, flushing out sediment and minerals that accumulate naturally in the pipes. The process cleans the pipes and helps achieve greater water flow through the mains. Flushing also allows operators to perform valve and hydrant inspections for fire protection.

Flushing is a safe, cost-effective alternative to adding chemicals to our water to clean pipes. Chemicals may change the taste and feel of the water. The flushing process is used nationally.

**BPU Offers Payment Options:
Save Time, Credit/Debit/E-Check Accepted**

The BPU offers convenient payment systems that allow customers to pay from the comfort of their homes! No need to stop in at BPU Customer Service to pay!

Callers may choose English or Spanish options.

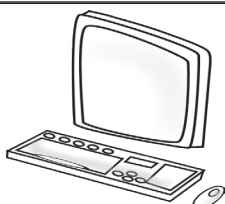
If you get confused while using the service, you can request to speak to a customer service representative at any time during the call.

**Weekly Clean-up:
Discard One Extra Item Each Week**

BPU Solid Waste customers may discard one small household item weighing 30-40 pounds or less at the curb *each week* with regular garbage collection—as long as the item can be picked up easily by one employee. Items should be about the size of a regular garbage bag. Examples of such disposables include small kitchen chairs, baby mattresses, dishes, clothes, lamps and one upright vacuum cleaner.

For disposal of large or electronic items, customers should arrange a special appointment for collection with a fee by calling the Garbage Hotline at 661-1651. This service is available all year long and includes items such as upholstered chairs, couches, refrigerators, mattresses, televisions, microwaves or anything containing an electronic digital display. If these objects are left curbside without an appointment, an extra fee may be charged to the Solid Waste account.



**Need a Simpler Way to
Get Rid of Yard Waste?**



Do you have trouble trying to get your garden clippings, leaves, brush and sticks to the Yard Waste Site? Do you want to avoid having to clean your vehicle after you've

taken brush and grass to the Site?

You may want to consider the BPU's Yard Waste Bag Program. Purchase four 30-gallon biodegradable bags that come in a \$10 pack at Customer Service. Fill the bags with brush, sticks and grass and put them at your curb for Tuesday pick-up. Next, call the BPU Garbage Hotline at 661-1651 before 3 p.m. Mondays to report that you're ready to have your bags collected on Tuesday.

You can have your bags picked up all at once or one at a time.

The \$10 fee pays for the collection service as well as the bags. The bags must be a BPU-labeled bag.

Using this service protects your back, keeps your vehicle clean and saves you time.

**Reminder to BPU Electric Customers!
Don't Miss Out on Energy Efficiency
Programs with Rebates, Audits!**

BPU Energy Efficiency Coordinator Dan Reynolds reminds residential electric customers that energy efficiency programs are designed to assist you in making home improvements that will result in lower electric bills. The BPU energy efficiency programs also provide rebates to you for making changes as a result of your audit.



"As we approach the Spring," says Reynolds, "it's time to think about signing up for a home energy audit. The audit will result in a report that suggests changes to make your residence more energy efficient."

Reynolds reminds customers that home energy audits are free for those people earning less than \$102,000 a year through New York State's "Green Jobs, Green New York" program. The BPU subsidizes audits for any electric customer making more than \$102,000 a year. Dan is available to help customers sign up for audits either through the State or through the BPU.

Audits must be performed by a Building Performance Institute (BPI)-certified contractor who is trained in energy efficiency construction.

Rebates are available to electric residential customers for work accomplished as a result of the audit, as long as the work is completed by a BPI-certified contractor.

An exception is the Attic Insulation Rebate Program. Homeowners may do the attic insulation work themselves and still qualify for the rebate. The rebate pays for fifty percent of the cost of material up to \$500 maximum per building and \$5,000 per person. The rebate



does not pay for the cost of installation.



"Our popular Energy Star Residential Rebate Program is still in effect as well," continues Reynolds. "We offer rebates for certain, new Energy Star-rated products such as WiFi thermostats, windows, entry doors, skylights, HVAC heat pumps, through-the-wall air conditioning units, central air conditioning units, heat pump water heaters and geothermal heat pumps.

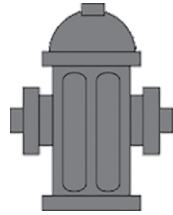
Chautauqua County require water systems to issue water testing results each year and to make them available to customers.

Spring Weekend Flush of Falconer Will Be Followed by DAYTIME FLUSHING in the Rest of the Water System

Spring weekend flushing in Falconer begins at 9 a.m. Friday, April 28, all day with a pre-flush in the areas of Mapleshade, Valmeere, Ralph & Aldren. Regular Village of Falconer flushing begins as usual at 9 p.m. Saturday, April 29, continuing all night through Sunday until the entire Village is flushed. Discolored water may be seen in Falconer and on the north side of Jamestown on Sunday as a result of this flushing. This area includes East Ellicott, Allen St. Extension, New York, Delaware, Parkway Drive, Peck-Settlement Road, the Mason Industrial Park and all intersecting streets.



The locations of where crews plan to flush in the morning or afternoon of any flushing day are posted below by date and general time of day.

As usual, flushing may cause discolored water in the neighborhoods close to the areas to be flushed and residents and businesses should avoid turning on faucets or flushing toilets during the flushing hours. If you avoid drawing water during your expected

flushing time, you may not even notice flushing in your area.

Daily flushing location descriptions, as below, will be posted on www.jamestownbpu.com, FACEBOOK & Twitter and area media. Actual maps showing hydrants (colored in bright blue) to be flushed each morning and afternoon are posted on the website's home page. You may call 661-1660 and choose extension 6 to hear the daily flushing locations. Questions? Call our Flushing Hotline at 661-1688 or Communications at 661-1680 for any flushing-related questions. If you receive voice mail, leave your telephone number, the name of your street and the names of the streets at the end of your block and we'll return your call with your flushing location.

An eight-day **daytime** flush of the rest of the BPU Water System will take place from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday, May 1, through Friday, May 5; the day flushing continues on Monday, May 8, through Wednesday, May 10. General morning flushing hours will be from 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. while afternoon flushing hours will be from 12:30 p.m.-4:30 p.m. An exception will be on Wednesday, May 3, when flushing will begin at 5:30 a.m. in the downtown section of Jamestown, with the goal of leaving the business district before 9 a.m.
